- (3) <u>Achievement Levels:</u> As with the curriculum and forms of assessments, the achievement levels will also be included on the same PowerPoint. Each of the assessments have different achievement levels, and those will be outlined in the presentation.
- (4) <u>In All Languages:</u> The PowerPoint will be available in English and Spanish. As needed, translators (or translations) will be provided.
