Mental Health Funding- by Allison. State gave Duval County to give 2-3 million dollars. Direct response from Parkland shooting. Partnered with Duval County to match that amount. Mental Health/ Full Service therapist in every school. October 1st going live if Kids Help Alliance if that money is pushed through to pay the therapists.
